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Faculty Profile: Meet Dr. Trent Applegate





Bloomington Safety Students Participate in School of Public Health Lab Decommissioning

This spring the School of Public Health at Indiana's Bloomington Deans Office reached out to the IU Safety Program for volunteers to assist in decommissioning a laboratory space located in SPH. The space, a nutrition lab was used for experimenting on organic and non-organic matter by researchers. Several safety students assisted in the disposal of toxic and hazardous materials, as well as restoring the lab to a state suitable for clinical trials and other research activities. With the help of safety students Maddi Covey and Derek Mitchell, the lab can now provide the infrastructure for students to further public health research and academic success.

Business Continuity Research Project Update

Last spring, the IU Safety program completed phase I of the business continuity survey and will begin the phase II this spring. This year, the American Society of Safety Professionals student section in collaboration with the SPH Dean's office are conducting an onsite audit of several teaching and research laboratories located in the School for Public Health. Key points associated with the survey include an examination of data storage, electrical usage, procedures for the storage of research samples, mana made and natural disaster planning, and documentation of various types of analytical equipment. The BCP is required by the Indiana University to meet FEMA standards for disaster recovery planning and Federal assistance in the event of a disaster. The plan will decrease the time and impact for recovery and assist School of Public Health Research Laboratories in continuing research and teaching activities in the event of an emergency.

This survey is the very first initiative to develop a school wide plan to prepare and recover from disasters. The study findings will be helpful by measuring the assessment of readiness as well as the assessment of need (equipment, space and infrastructure). Interested in participating in our research group?
